

Introduction

Our firm, Kennedy Wealth & Tax Management, LLC, is an investment adviser registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. We feel that it is important for you to understand how advisory and brokerage services and fees differ in order to determine which type of account is right for you. There are free and simple tools available to research firms and financial professionals at www.investor.gov/CRS, which also provides educational materials about investment advisers, broker-dealers, and investing.

What investment services and advice can you provide me?

We are a registered investment adviser that offers investment advisory services, including Asset Management, Comprehensive Portfolio Management, Financial Planning & Consulting, and Trustee Support to clients. If you open an advisory account with our firm, we will meet with you to understand your current financial situation, existing resources, objectives, and risk tolerance. Based on what we learn, we will recommend a portfolio of investments that is monitored at least quarterly, and if necessary, rebalanced to meet your changing needs and goals. We will offer you advice on a regular basis and contact you at least annually to discuss your portfolio.

You can select in our agreement whether we are allowed to buy and sell investments in your account without asking you in advance (“discretion”) or only after receiving your permission (“non-discretion”). If you select non-discretion, you make the ultimate decision regarding the purchase or sale of investments. Any limitations will be described in the signed advisory agreement. We will have discretion or non-discretion until the advisory agreement is terminated by you or our firm. We do not restrict our advice to limited types of products or investments.

Our firm generally requires a minimum household account balance of \$1,000,000 to open an account for our Asset Management and Comprehensive Portfolio Management services. Our firm also generally requires a minimum account balance of \$1,250,000 to engage us for our Trustee Support service. However, the minimum account balances for our Asset Management, Comprehensive Portfolio Management, and Trustee Support services may be waived at our firm’s sole discretion. We generally require a minimum annual fee of \$7,500 per household for our Comprehensive Portfolio Management service, \$6,500 per household for our Asset Management service, and \$9,500 for our Trustee Support service. However, the minimum annual fee per household for the Asset Management, Comprehensive Portfolio Management, and Trustee Support services may be waived at our firm’s sole discretion. Written financial plans are generally assessed a minimum fee of \$3,500. Financial Planning & Consulting is included in our Comprehensive Portfolio Management services for no additional fee. Financial Planning & Consulting is also offered as a separate service for a flat or hourly fee. We do not monitor your investments for the Financial Planning & Consulting service.

- Given my financial situation, should I choose an investment advisory service? Why or why not? How will you choose investments to recommend to me? What is your relevant experience, including your licenses, education and other qualifications? What do those qualifications mean?

What fees will I pay?

You will be charged an ongoing annual fee applied quarterly based on the value of the assets in your account. Our Asset Management fee schedule ranges from 0.20% to 1.30%, while our Comprehensive Portfolio Management fee schedule ranges from 0.40% to 1.50%. The fee schedule ranges from 0.20% to 0.75% for our Trustee Support service. Advisory fees charged for these services depend on the value of the assets in your account. The more assets you have in your advisory account, the more you will pay us. We therefore have an incentive to increase the assets in your advisory account in order to increase our fees. Our fees vary and are negotiable. The amount you pay will depend, for example, on the services you receive and the amount of assets in your account. Our firm’s fees will be automatically deducted from your advisory account, which will reduce the value of your advisory account. In rare cases, we will agree to send you invoices rather than automatically deduct our firm’s fees from your advisory account. Our maximum flat fee is \$10,000 and maximum hourly rate is \$350 for our Financial Planning & Consulting service. We charge you upon completion of the project.

The custodian that holds your assets charges you a transaction fee when we buy or sell an investment for you. The custodian’s transaction fees are in addition to our firm’s fees for our Asset Management, Comprehensive Portfolio Management, and Trustee Support services.

You may also pay charges imposed by the custodian holding your accounts for certain investments and maintaining your account. Some investments, such as mutual funds, index funds, exchange traded funds, and variable annuities, charge additional fees that will reduce the value of your investments over time. In addition, you may have to pay fees such as “surrender charges” to sell variable annuities.

You will pay fees and costs whether you make or lose money on your investments. Fees and costs will reduce any amount of money you make on your investments over time. Please make sure you understand what fees and costs you are paying.

Questions to Ask Us:

- Help me understand how these fees and costs may affect my investments. If I give you \$10,000 to invest, how much will go to fees and costs and how much will be invested for me?

What are your legal obligations to me when acting as my investment adviser? How else does your firm make money and what conflicts of interest do you have?

When we act as your investment adviser, we have to act in your best interest and not put our interest ahead of yours. At the same time, the way we make money creates some conflicts with your interests. You should understand and ask us about these conflicts because they can affect the investment advice, we provide you. Here are some examples to help you understand what this means:

Tax and Accounting Services Affiliation:

Our firm's principal, Kevin A. Kennedy, CPA, also owns and operates Kennedy Company, P.C., a CPA firm that provides tax preparation, tax planning, and accounting services. Many of our advisory clients also engage Kennedy Company, P.C. for these services. When you use the CPA firm, Mr. Kennedy earns additional income. This creates a conflict of interest because we have a financial incentive to recommend that you use Kennedy Company, P.C. for tax and accounting services. You are not required to use Kennedy Company, P.C., and you may choose any tax or accounting provider.

Asset-Based Fee Incentive:

Because we charge a fee based on the value of your assets, we have an incentive to encourage you to increase the assets in your account, which increases our compensation. This may create a conflict when we recommend that you roll over retirement plan assets or transfer assets from another adviser.

How do your financial professionals make money?

Our financial professionals are compensated based on:

- The revenue our firm earns from advisory services
- The amount of client assets they service
- The time and complexity required to meet clients' needs

In addition, our firm's principal earns income from Kennedy Company, P.C., a related CPA firm, when advisory clients engage that firm for tax preparation or accounting services.

Do you or your financial professionals have legal or disciplinary history?
